Curriculum

Our Ph.D. program is classified into 2 plans, Plan 1.1 (research plan) and Plan 2.1 (coursework plan), with the minimum 48 credits for a regular three years of study.

Applicants must hold a Master's degree in Agricultural Economics, Economics or other related fields with a minimum of 6 credits in economics.
