Program details	<p>For undergraduate and graduate students who wish to participate in the exchange program at Nagoya University in fields related to their current studies, or those who wish to conduct research under the supervision of a Professor at Nagoya University.</p> <p>Students, intending to attend classes taught in English, must have an English Proficiency Level equivalent to a TOEFL iBT score of 79 or a TOEIC score of 780 or higher.</p> <p>Students, attending classes taught in Japanese, must be qualified for the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) for the N1 level.</p>

Applicant Qualifications	<p>1. Must be currently enrolled at Kasetsart University; a sophomore or higher years for undergraduate level or in a Graduate level</p> <p>2. Must have a good academic record, with a cumulative GPA of no less than 3.00. If applying for the JASSO scholarship, the cumulative GPA must also be no less than 3.00.</p> <p>3. Must have good communication skills in either English or Japanese, depending on the language of intended courses, as follows:</p> <p style="padding-left: 20px;">3.1 For courses taught in English, students must have a TOEFL score of at least 79 for iBT, TOEIC of at least 780, IELTS of at least 6.0, or other equivalent tests at CEFR B2 level.</p>	

	<p>3.2 For courses taught in Japanese, students must have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) at the N1 level.</p> <p>4. Must be able to cover their living expenses while in Japan for the duration of the exchange program.</p> <p>5. Must maintain their student status at Kasetsart University throughout the duration of the program, and must return to continue their studies at Kasetsart University immediately upon program completion.</p>

Required Documents	<p>Students must prepare the following documents along with a nomination letter from their faculty to the International Affairs Division (IAD):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>Application form</i> for the Kasetsart University Student Exchange Program (use the form provided by the IAD). 2. <i>Study Plan</i> that shows and explains your interest program for the NUPACE exchange program. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2.1 For those intending to attend courses; explain your interests in the curriculum and courses that will be taken. Course and curriculum information can be found in the NUPACE Prospectus at http://nupace.iee.nagoya-u.ac.jp. (Must be typed on A4 paper; minimum of 400 words in English, or 800 characters in Japanese). 2.2 For those intending to conduct research; propose a research plan. (Must be typed on A4 paper; minimum of 800 words in English, or 1,600 characters in Japanese). 3. <i>Official Transcript of Academic Records</i> (stamped by the Office of Education Administration). Graduate-level applicants must present official transcripts for both undergraduate and graduate levels. 4. <i>Language Proficiency Form and Supporting Documents</i> (TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS, and/or Japanese Language Proficiency Test), as required by each program. 5. <i>Student Status Certificate</i> in English (issued by the Office of Education Administration).

	<p>6. <i>A copy of the passport.</i></p> <p>7. <i>Statement of Bank Account Balance</i> in English, showing the current balance of the student or their guardian:</p> <p>7.1 For one semester, financial evidence must show a minimum of 150,000 Baht.</p> <p>7.2 For two semesters, financial evidence must show a minimum of 300,000 Baht.</p> <p>Note: Students nominated to Nagoya University must complete additional online application procedures. The IAD will notify the students directly later.</p>
Expense	Nominated students will be exempt from tuition fees at Nagoya University. However, students are fully responsible for other expenses such as international airfare, accommodation, meals, domestic transportation, and life and health insurance. The living expenses in Japan are approximately 100,000 Yen per month (approx. 31,000 Baht).
Financial Support	Students may apply for a JASSO scholarship: 80,000 Yen/month (approx. 24,000 Baht) for additional financial aid. Note: Applicants must first be able to cover their own expenses, as the scholarship is limited.
Deadline	Submit application through applicant's faculty to the IAD by 20 th February 2025
