1. Program details	<p>1. Special Auditing Students: This program is designed for undergraduate and graduate students wishing to participate in an exchange program in their current field of study. Students must have a strong proficiency in Japanese, as most courses are taught in Japanese. If applicants lack sufficient knowledge of the Japanese language, they will have limited course selection options.</p> <p>2. Special Research Students: This program is intended for graduate students who wish to conduct research under the supervision of an academic advisor at Mie University</p>

Applicant Qualifications	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Applicants must be current students of Kasetsart University, either undergraduate students (at least in their second year) or graduate students, depending on the exchange program they are applying for. 2. Applicants must have strong proficiency in both English and Japanese. If applicants lack sufficient Japanese language skills, their course selection options will be limited. 3. Applicants must be able to cover their living expenses in Japan for the entire duration of the exchange program. 4. Applicants must maintain their student status at Kasetsart University throughout the entire duration of the exchange program. After completing the program, they must return to continue their studies at Kasetsart University

Application for Kasetsart University Exchange Student Program (using the form provided by the IAD)2. Application for Admission of Exchange Student (Forms 1-1 to 1-3) with all details fully completed and typed (to be submitted in Excel format)3. Checklist (using the provided form) with the applicant's signature4. Questionnaire Sheet (using the provided form) based on the faculty and type of program applied for, as follows:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Questionnaire sheet for Faculty of Humanities, Law and Economics, and Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences (Form 2-1, Form 2-2)○ Questionnaire sheet for Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences (Form 3)○ Questionnaire sheet for Faculty of Engineering and Graduate School of Engineering (Form 4)5. Expense	Selected applicants will be exempted from tuition fees at Mie University. However, other expenses such as food, accommodation, domestic travel, airfare, and health insurance must be covered by the students themselves. On average, the cost of living in Japan is approximately 80,000 – 100,000 Yen per month (about 20,000 – 25,000 Baht).
Financial Support	There is an opportunity to apply for the Mie University Scholarship, which provides 20,000 Yen per month (about 5,000 Baht). Note: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The university will select and nominate only one suitable applicant for the scholarship.2. The nominated applicant must be able to cover their expenses as the scholarship amount is insufficient to cover the cost of living in Japan.
Deadline	The documents must be submitted to the International Affairs Division by February 11, 2025.
